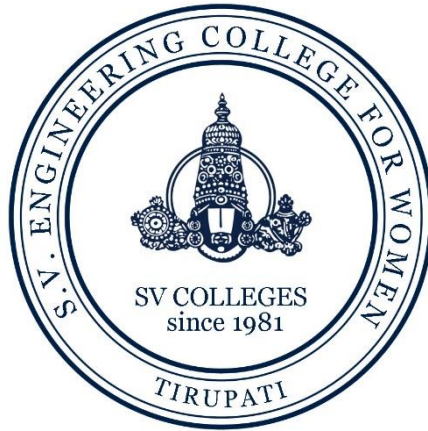

All the above UG courses have been approved by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi and affiliated to JNTUA, Ananthapuramu. CSE Department has been recognized as Research Centre approved by JNTUA, Ananthapuramu.

## **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

UG admissions are made on par with other colleges of Engineering and Technology in the state of Andhra Pradesh through the common entrance test (EAMCET) conducted by the State Government. While 70% of the seats allotted are based on merit in EAMCET, 30% of the seats are earmarked for Management Quota. In addition, the engineering Diploma holders based on their merit in ECET (FDH) are admitted into Lateral Entry (II year B Tech courses) to the tune of 20% of the total intake.

## **PG Admissions**

70% of M Tech admissions are based on merit and GATE/PGECET. Remaining 30% of the seats are earmarked for Management Quota.

## **SCHOLARSHIP**

Scholarships in the form of full or partial waiver of tuition fee have been provided by the Management for meritorious and socially economically weaker students. Text books required for each semester have been provided to class toppers by the Management.

## **GUIDELINES FOR THE STUDENTS**

S.V Engineering College for Women is a portal for transforming students into fine engineers. Having chosen engineering education, it is whole and sole responsibility of the student to well utilize every minute of the four year program. The student should derive every benefit out of experienced faculty, facilities and opportunities available in the campus.

### **1. Discipline**

SVEW symbolizes discipline, which plays an active role in building healthy society. Students are expected to abide by the rules and regulations formulated by the Institution. Students participating in various inter and intra competitions, conferences, seminars, workshops should maintain the dignity of the institution.

### **2. Tuition fees**

Students are expected to pay the fees before the due date as notified by the college. Fees once paid will not be refunded. If any student discontinues the course in the middle, she has to pay the fees for the entire course.

### **3. Ragging and eve-teasing**

- (i) Ragging and eve-teasing are considered as crimes. They are strictly prohibited by an act promulgated by the Govt. of Tamil Nadu with a fine upto Rs.10,000/- and 2 years of rigorous imprisonment. Anti - Ragging Toll free Number: 1800-180-5522 or 155222.
- (ii) Students indulging in any form of ragging or Eve-Teasing inside the college or Hostel premises or outside the campus shall summarily be expelled from the college.

#### **4. Dress code / late arrival**

Students should be punctual, on time to the college with their ID cards, neatly dressed in accordance to the college dress code i.e., Chudidarand with the approved uniform during the practical sessions.

#### **5. Communication within the campus**

In order to cater to the industry expectations, the college emphasizes on building a strong language competency. The students are directed to communicate only in English while interacting with the faculty and fellow students inside the campus.

#### **6. Academic Pursuit**

All students are instructed to stay focused in achieving the academic excellence. Available time must be used for gaining knowledge and practicing Science / Engineering. Any thoughts and deeds in this regard are duly encouraged and supported by the management.

#### **7. Extra / Co-curricular Activities**

Students are instructed to actively utilize the opportunities to participate and / or to conduct symposiums, workshops, and other performance enhancement related activities.

#### **8. Special Hours**

To facilitate outside class interactions and activities among students as well as faculty, special hours are allotted by the management. Value-add on courses are introduced for students of III and IV B.Tech from 2.30 to 4.00 pm on skills like Logical, Analytical, Communication and Programming skills. Students can also make the best use of these special hours by participating in various college club events and sports related activities.

#### **9. Class room manners**

Unnecessary discussion among girls is strictly prohibited. Unnecessary movements from one bench to another bench/table in the Laboratory / workshop are strictly prohibited. Students of one class should not go to another class for any reason whatsoever.

## 10. Approval of leave

Students who want to avail leave/permission must and should get permission from the concerned class teacher / in charge and HOD. Students absenting themselves for more than a week with/without prior approval must submit the medical certificate and has to meet HOD and Principal with her parents to attend the classes. Students are not strictly encouraged to avail leave / permission during internal tests.

## 11. Attendance Requirement for Appearing University Exam

- A student shall be eligible to appear for University examinations if he/she acquires a minimum of 75% of attendance in aggregate of all the subjects in a semester.
- Condonation of shortage of attendance in aggregate up to 10% (65% and above and below 75%) in each semester may be granted by the College Academic Committee.
- Shortage of Attendance below 65% in aggregate shall in NO case be condoned.
- A stipulated fee shall be payable towards condonation of shortage of attendance to the University.
- Students whose shortage of attendance is not condoned in any semester are not eligible to take their end examination of that class and their registration shall stand cancelled.
- A student will not be promoted to the next semester unless he satisfies the attendance requirements of the present semester. They may seek readmission for that semester when offered next.

## 12. COURSE PATTERN:

- The entire course of study is for four academic years. All years shall be on semester pattern.
- A student eligible to appear for the end examination in a subject, but absent or has failed in the end examination may appear for that subject at the next supplementary examination when offered.
- When a student is detained due to lack of credits/shortage of attendance she may be re-admitted when the semester is offered after fulfillment of academic regulations. In such case, he/she shall be in the academic regulations into which he/she is readmitted.

## With-holding of Results:

If the candidate has any dues not paid to the university or if any case of indiscipline or malpractice is pending against him, the result of the candidate shall be withheld and he will not be allowed/promoted into the next higher semester. The issue of awarding degree is liable to be withheld in such cases.



## Grading

After each subject is evaluated for 100 marks, the marks obtained in each subject will be converted to a corresponding letter grade as given below, depending on the range in which the marks obtained by the student fall.

- i. A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear for that subject when the next supplementary examination offered. Same is the case with a student who obtains 'Ab' in end examination.
- ii. For **audit** courses "Satisfactory" or "Unsatisfactory" shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of SGPA/CGPA.

### **13. SEMESTER GRADE POINT AVERAGE (SGPA) AND CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE (CGPA):**

- i. The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.,

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum (C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

where,  $C_i$  is the number of credits of the  $i^{\text{th}}$  subject and  $G_i$  is the grade point scored by the student in the  $i^{\text{th}}$  course.

- ii. The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be computed in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a program, i.e.,

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum (C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

where “ $S_i$ ” is the SGPA of the  $i^{\text{th}}$  semester and  $C_i$  is the total number of credits in that semester.

- iii. Both SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.
- iv. While computing the SGPA the subjects in which the student is awarded Zero grade points will also be included.

*Grade Point:* It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.

*Letter Grade:* It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters S, A, B, C, D, E and F.

#### **Award of Class:**

After a student has satisfied the requirements prescribed for the completion of the program and is eligible for the award of B. Tech. degree he shall be placed in one of the following four classes

#### **14. GAP YEAR:**

Gap year concept of Student Entrepreneur in Residence shall be introduced and outstanding students who wish to pursue entrepreneurship are allowed to take a break of one year at any time after II year to pursue entrepreneurship full time. This period may be extended to two years at the most and these two years would not be counted for the time for the maximum time for graduation. The Principal of the respective college shall forward such proposals submitted

by the students to the University. An evaluation committee shall be constituted by the University to evaluate the proposal submitted by the student and the committee shall decide whether or not to permit the student(s) to avail the Gap Year.

## **15. TRANSITORY REGULATIONS:**

Discontinued, detained, or failed candidates are eligible for readmission as and when the semester is offered after fulfillment of academic regulations.

Candidates who have been detained for want of attendance or not fulfilled academic requirements or who have failed after having undergone the course in earlier regulations or have discontinued and wish to continue the course are eligible for admission into the unfinished semester from the date of commencement of class work with the same or equivalent subjects as and when subjects are offered, subject to Section 2 and they will be in the academic regulations into which they get readmitted.

Candidates who were permitted with Gap Year shall be eligible for rejoining into the succeeding year of their B. Tech from the date of commencement of class work, and they will be in the academic regulations into which the candidate is presently rejoining.

## **16. Minimum Instruction Days:**

The minimum instruction days including exams for each semester shall be 90 days.

## **17. Medium of Instruction**

The Medium of Instruction is **English** for all courses, laboratories, internal and external examinations, Comprehensive Viva-Voce, seminar presentations and project reports.

## **18. Student Transfers**

Student transfers shall be as per the guidelines issued by the Government of Andhra Pradesh and the University from time to time.

## **19. LATERAL ENTRY SCHEME:**

### **Course Pattern**

- The entire course of study is three academic years on semester pattern.
- A student eligible to appear for the end examination in a subject, but absent at it or has failed in the end examination may appear for that subject at the next supplementary examination offered.
- When a student is detained due to lack of credits/shortage of attendance he may be re-admitted when the semester is offered after fulfillment of academic regulations, he shall be in the academic regulations into which he is readmitted.

The regulations are to be adopted as that of B. Tech. (Regular).

### **Award of Class:**

After a student has satisfied the requirements prescribed for the completion of the program and is eligible for the award of B. Tech. Degree he shall be placed in one of the following four classes:

First Class with distinction	70% and above	From the aggregate marks secured for 134 Credits (i.e. II year to IV year)
First Class	Below 70% but not less than 60%	
Second Class	Below 60% but not less than 50%	
Pass Class	Below 50% but not less than 40%	

The regulations are to be adopted as that of B. Tech. (Regular). All other regulations as applicable for B.Tech. Four-year degree course (Regular) will hold good for B. Tech. (Lateral Entry Scheme).

## **20. Laboratory / Record**

- Each department is well equipped with the state of the art lab facilities encompassing computers, advanced software, networking components, other equipment and machineries
- In each laboratory class, students should complete the practical observation entries in their observation notebooks and get it signed by the staff in-charge of the lab before leaving the laboratory.
- After the completion of each experiment, students should complete their record writing and get it signed by the faculty concerned before the next practical class, failing which they will not be permitted to attend the subsequent practical classes.

## **21. Prizes for academic excellence**

To motivate the students and recognize the academic excellence of the students, the management awards every year cash prizes to the students obtaining the highest score in the college in each branch of study. The basis for the award is the aggregate marks obtained by the students in both the semester examinations of the year including practical in her first attempt.

## **22. Parent – Teachers Meeting**

Parents can meet their mentor/ class incarge/ HoD to know the status of their ward during 4.00 to 5.00 pm on weekdays and 9.00 to 5.00 pm on Saturdays. Defaulters will not be permitted to attend the college.

### **23. Medical Facilities**

A separate medical room is available in the campus with two beds. A resident doctor would provide immediate consultation for hostel students. The college has medical tie-up with Swarna Nursing Home, Opposite to State Bank of India, LeelaMahal Circle to cater emergency services.

### **24. Students' Advisors for Counseling**

To give personal attention, a group comprising of 20 students are assigned to a faculty Mentor. Faculty Mentor offer psychological and confidential counseling services to help them explore and understand the opportunities and meet the challenges. Counseling is also provided to groom and support in stressful situations. This counseling helps the students to share their issues, needs and get proper guidance from the mentors and also motivates them for further excellence in academics.

### **25. Cell phones**

Use of cell phones by the students is strictly prohibited in the college campus.

### **26. Transport**

Students using college transport should follow the college transport timings and maintain discipline and decorum, while traveling.

- (i) Students should not get down in between the points of their start and destination.
- (ii) Students should not change the buses allotted to them on their own.

### **27. Information Resource Center (LIBRARY)**

The central library is spacious, well laid out with modern facilities. The Central Library houses a good up-to-date book collection benefitting the needs of the user community at large. It subscribes to many National and International Journals catering to the information needs of the students and faculty. The library is fully computerized so as to facilitate easy and quick access to library collections through OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). It allows searching by author, title, subject, call number, keywords, and Boolean search. The students enjoy free access to peer reviewed scholarly journals through online database namely IEEE, DELNET, SWAYAM, Vigyanprasar Digital Library, National Digital Library and INFLIBNET – NLIST (UGC INFONET Digital Library Consortium).

## Collection

- The resource center has 15,468 volumes of books consisting of 2,402 titles.
- 70 National journals and 05 International journals.
- 481 Project reports.
- 411 Books CDs.

## Membership Procedures

Membership is open to all the staff and students of the college.

All student members should return the books at the end of the final semester and obtain a “No Dues Certificate” from the library. Similarly, the staff members who intend to leave the college should settle all the dues and obtain “No Dues Certificate” from the librarian.

## Other Facilities

### Institutional Membership

Our college Library is a member of DELNET (Developing Library Network) library network, to facilitate sharing of resources.

### Digital Library

The Library is connected to the 100 Mbps internet service hub of the college and has 25 systems for accessing the internet from 9.00 am - 5.00 pm.

### Reprographic Facilities (Photocopying)

Photocopying facility is available for students, at a nominal cost.

### Loss of Cards

- Loss of ID cards should be reported to the library immediately

- Duplicate cards will be issued by Computer Centre on payment of Rs.100/-
- Duplicate cards will be issued to members on giving an undertaking that they will continue to be held responsible for any loss arising from inadvertent use or misuse of the card lost.

### **Issue and Return of Books**

- Books other than reference books will be issued to student members for a period of 15 days, Non-Teaching staff members for a period of 90 days. For teachers, the loan period is 180 days.
- Reference books will be issued to all the members at the end of the day for overnight use only and they should be returned the next day positively before 9.00 am.
- Upon borrowing the books, members, should verify whether the books are in good condition and if any damage/ marking should be immediately reported to the Librarian failing which the member to whom the book was issued will be held responsible.
- Books that are in special demand may be lent for only short period.

### **Overdue Charges**

- Rs. 1.00 per day per book
- Undue delay in the return of books will result in the membership put on hold.

### **Loss/Damage of Books**

- Loss of books, if any, shall be reported to the library immediately and it shall be replaced by another good copy with overdue charges if any.
- In case the borrower is unable to replace the lost books, twice the present cost of the books plus overdue charges, if any, will be levied.

### **Reservation of Books**

Reservations for the books can be done by the students and the reserved book will be kept at the counter for 2 days for issue. If they fail to collect the books within 2 days, the books will be given to the next member in the waiting list. The reservation status may be checked using the Library register.

## **General**

- All members shall sign (scan your id) in the e-gate register at the entrance as a token of their acceptance to adhere to the rules of the library
- Personal books, files and other articles (except a small notebook or loose sheets of papers) will not be allowed inside the library. They shall be deposited at the property counter at the entrance.
- Silence shall be observed inside the library.
- Cell Phones inside the library are strictly prohibited.
- Any marking or writing inside the books by the members is strictly prohibited. If any damage/ marking are found, the member should replace the book.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, the decision of the authorities of this institution in all matters shall be final and binding.

## **Note**

Students should follow prescribed text books and internationally reputed reference books instead of local author books to enhance their learning and get better advantage in exams and placement interviews. Continuous and constant support would be given by the faculty.

## **Text books access for top rank students**

Students who secure top 5 positions in JNTUA University Exams from each class of the respective branch of study are eligible to access library books throughout the Semester.

## **Suggestions and Complaints**

The library always welcomes useful suggestions from Members and the Visitors. It is also responsive to all complaints lodged by users about the collections and services.



## 28. Hostel

The College provides a separate hostel for Girls. It is spacious, well-furnished hostel. Apart from hygienic food, the hostel provides 24x7 Wi-Fi facility and recreational facilities such as TV room, indoor games, etc. The hostel has its live-in warden, and in view of the limited hostel accommodation; candidates should note that the grant of admission to a programme of study in the College does not ensure allotment of hostel accommodation and that the accommodation will be offered to the eligible applicants subject to availability.

### Rules and regulations

Application for admission to the hostels should be made in the prescribed form. A student seeking hostel admission must give an undertaking in writing that he/she will abide by the rules of the hostel.

The parent or guardian shall also endorse this.

1. Admission of the students to the hostels will be decided by the Principal (Chief Warden)
2. Attendance will be taken daily by the Deputy Warden after dinner.
3. Hostellers should not absent themselves from the college during the college hours and stay in the hostel without proper permission from the deputy warden and the Principal.
4. No hosteller is permitted to leave the hostel without the permission of the deputy Warden / Principal / Dean.
6. Only parents / authorized visitors are allowed to meet their wards.
7. Visiting Time:

4.00 P.M – 5.30 P.M	-	Working Days
9.00 A.M – 5.00 P.M	-	Holidays
8. Hostellers are not permitted to bring parent / non-members to stay in the hostel in any case.
9. Day scholars are not permitted to enter the hostel, if found, stringent action will be taken against inmates accommodating the day scholars
10. Hostellers are advised not to keep money or valuables in their rooms. The hostel or college authorities will not be responsible for lost items.

11. PCs / Laptops will be allowed inside the hostel with prior permission only.
12. Hostellers should strictly follow the mess timings. Food will not be served after mess timings.
13. Hostellers must switch off all electric connections before leaving their rooms. Use of electrical and electronic home appliances inside the room is restricted.
14. To leave the hostel during holidays, students should produce out pass at the entrance. Prior permission from the Principal/Director – Student Affairs is required to receive an out pass.
15. Hostellers should not tamper with the electrical installations and furniture. Cost of damages to any hostel property shall be recovered from the inmates of the Hostel. Any violation of discipline in the hostel premises shall be dealt seriously and the punishment may be, levy of fine, suspension or expulsion from the hostel or even from the college.
16. Matters which are not covered by the above rules shall be decided by the Principal / Dean as and when needed and the decision shall be final.
17. Ragging or eve-teasing in the College hostel is totally banned. Students indulging in such activities will be viewed as per the Government order promulgated by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in this matter.
18. Guests or outsiders are strictly prohibited from entering the hostel premises without prior permission of the warden in-charge.
19. Once a student reserves his/her seat and pays the fees for hostel accommodation, he/she will not be eligible for refund, even if he/she chooses not to stay in the hostel
20. Hot water is available for hostellers through the solar power water heaters.

## **RAGGING – AN OFFENCE**

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a cognizable offence that will result into severe punishment including summary expulsion from the university.

1. “Ragging means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes:
  - (a) Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student or
  - (b) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course willingly act or perform.
2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates “Ragging” within or outside any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
4. Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.
5. (i) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complaints of a ragging to the head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.
  - (ii) The decision of the head of the educational institution or the person responsible for the management of the educational institution that any student has indulged in ragging under sub section (1) shall be final.

### **GENERAL RULES:**

1. Ragging within and outside Campus is strictly prohibited.
2. All the students should wear the identity tags inside the campus.
3. Coming late to the class will not be permitted.
4. The students should not use mobile phones inside the campus
5. All students should follow dress code in the campus.
6. Smoking, consumption or possession of toxic drinks or drugs within the campus is strictly prohibited. Entering the campus under the influence of toxic drinks or drugs is also prohibited.

7. Do not litter the campus. Keep the campus neat and clean.
8. Any scribbling /writing on the desks, drawing tables / boards, or the walls should be totally avoided.
9. Students should not undertake any pleasure trips or outings on their own without the permission of the HOD / Associate warden in writing. Pleasure trips or outings will not be permitted as this has resulted in loss of valuable lives in the past.
10. The hostel rooms should be maintained neat and clean without garbage, dust and cobwebs.
11. The students should ensure the safety of their belongings in the hostel rooms. They are advised not to keep excess cash and valuables in their rooms.
12. The rooms should be kept locked whenever the students leave the room.
13. Guest/Visitors/Day Scholars are not permitted to enter any hostel, without the permission of the Resident Warden.

**Violation of any of the above rules including Hostel rules will be viewed seriously and severe action will be taken against erring students.**

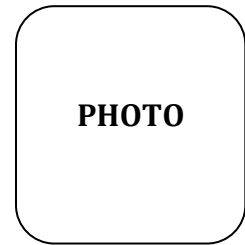
